A Message from the Chairman

One of our most important duties as Supervisors is be good stewards of your tax dollars and ensure the Township is in good financial health—both short term and long term. As your elected officials we take this responsibility very seriously and want to make sure every resident is aware of how their money is being used to run the Township.

Most people don't know that for every \$1 collected in property tax, just 3 cents goes to the Township. The other 97 cents goes to the school district (81 cents) and the County (16 cents). For that 3% of property taxes, plus the .5% Earned Income Tax (EIT) that goes to the Township, residents get all of their emergency services (including police, fire and ambulance), road maintenance, traffic improvements, inlet repairs, snow plowing and parks and recreation services. Our Township expenses are among the lowest in Bucks County. We accomplish this by seeking the lowest prices for goods and services, using fewer employees, sharing resources and competitive collective bargaining agreements.

Newtown Township relies more heavily than other municipalities on EIT revenue from the employees who work in our Township but live where there is no EIT. In fact when Lockheed Martin did business here, the Township got \$700,000 a year just from that one company. Unfortunately, Lockheed Martin left the Township in 2016 and while the property did sell to KVK Tech, very few new jobs have been created to replace this revenue. To make things worse, other municipalities are enacting their own EIT which has cost us another \$300,000 in revenue. That's a loss of \$1 million in annual revenue for a budget of \$12.5 million dollars.

In February, the Board of Supervisors voted to raise the property tax by one mill, from 3.5 to 4.5 mills. This is an increase of \$40 per household on average—just \$.77 per week. This still keeps our property taxes among the lowest in Bucks County where the average is 14 mills. Even for municipalities with an EIT, the average is 12 mills—nearly 3x our property tax rate. The revenue from this 1 mill increase is dedicated to investments in safety, namely the Newtown Ambulance Squad and maintaining the township's fire hydrant network. Creating these separate tax funds will increase the transparency of the township's budget and relieve the strain on our general fund.

Prior to 2008, the ambulance squad had a dedicated property tax millage. Over the past 10 years, the township has been supporting the squad out of our general fund for a total of more than \$1 million. The consequent strain on Township finances caused us to lay off essential employees, neglect the repair and re-painting of township roads and other infrastructure, forced the Township to borrow money just to make payroll, deferred the replacement of aging police squad cars, deferred road maintenance and prompted us to sell off an asset for less than fair market value that was yielding the township annual revenue of \$45,000.

Nobody likes to raise taxes, but 4 out of the 5 members on the Board of Supervisors believe the modest increase we approved is a prudent step toward improving a financial condition that had degraded over many years. The new revenues will enable the township to make long-overdue investments in our community that will make it a nicer and safer place to live and which improve our property values.

One example is the Township's Act 209 traffic plan, which hasn't been updated in nearly 20 years. Now we can comfortably budget the \$20,000 expense to update the plan, which will enable the use of \$1.5 million in our traffic impact fee fund (fees paid by developers) to address traffic safety and congestion issues throughout the Township. This is the type of common sense spending that residents expect from their elected officials.

Township residents need to understand that our revenue stream is still vulnerable: we lose income every time an area town or township institutes its own earned income tax, or an employer moves out of Newtown Township. That's one of the reasons the Board has reestablished a Finance Committee that will work to find creative ways to increase revenues without raising taxes and keep our Township financially strong.

credit card payments. You may pay by credit card or e-check. There is a convenience fee for this service which is outlined when you make your payment. This information is also available on the back of your tax bill.

If you need to make a change to your occupational status or report a change in residency related to your Occupation Tax bill, please contact Council Rock School District Tax Office to report your change 215-944-1090.

Keystone Collections Group is the collector of the 1% EIT Tax. Payments must be made directly to Keystone Collections Group. 

It is also the time of the year vehicle crashes are the highest among teenagers nationwide. Talk to your teens about how to be a safe driver.

- Make sure everyone wears their seat belt and no overcrowding in the vehicle.

- · Let your children know that they can call you if they do not have a sober driver.
- Remind them that texting while driving is now against the law.

Newtown Township Police Department Makes Crash Reports Available Online

The Newtown Township Police Department is digitizing its crash reports through a partnership with the CARFAX Police Crash Assistance Program. The reports are stored electronically in a secure database and available for purchase online at www.crashdocs.org.

Reports that are needed by involved parties, insurance companies and other members of the public can be easily obtained online within minutes from the home or office. Please consider that the Vehicle Code allows for up to fifteen business days for an initial report to be completed and submitted. Serious accidents may require additional time to be finalized.

STEPS:

- Call the Newtown Township Police Department (215-579-1000) to obtain the incident report number for the accident
- 2. Go to www.crashdocs.org
- Follow the drop down menu for Pennsylvania >>> Newtown Township Police Department
- Enter your Email address >>> Name of involved party >>> Date of accident >>> Report number
- 5. Follow on screen prompts to completion

Report Traffic Safety Concerns via USPS or Online

We understand that as residents of Newtown Township you travel within and through our many roadways on a daily basis. In some cases you may have concerns regarding traffic safety within and around your neighborhood.

If you would like to submit a concern or a request for a traffic safety review of your neighborhood, please review the items below:

- First determine what you are concerned about and any pertinent information regarding the concern.
- IF THE PROBLEM IS AN EMERGENCY, PLEASE DIAL 9-1-1.

If not an emergency, you can contact the Police Department and submit a request online utilizing this site: http://www.newtownpa.gov/report-a-traffic-safety-concern-to-newtown-township

You can also contact the Police Department with your concern by either:

- Calling the Police Dispatch Center (215) 598-7121 and request a Police Officer be sent to your location in Newtown Township to discuss your concern.
- Sending a letter to the Police Department; you may mail your letter or the online questionnaire and attach
 any supporting documents to the Office of the Chief of Police, Newtown Township Police Department, 100
 Municipal Drive, Newtown, PA 18940.
- You may stop at the Police Administration Building and drop off material in person.

TRAFFIC SAFETY ENFORCEMENT & STUDIES: One of the Police Department's primary tasks is to address the traffic safety concerns in our community. Therefore, if you have a traffic safety concern, please let us know what it is and we will do our best to try and address it for you.

CHANGING SPEED LIMITS & POSTING OF SIGNS: Although the Police Department patrols all of the roads in the Township, only the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation [PennDot] can authorize certain signs or speed limit changes or other traffic control device installations or changes to occur on State roads. Changes on Township roads are within the preview of the Board of Supervisors. Such changes generally require a traffic study and legislative action by the Board.



For a number of years The Newtown Township Police Department has provided this service to residents and property owners. While on routine patrol, a police officer pays extra attention to your home while you are away. This service can be provided by simply calling the Police Business Office at (215) 579-1000 x398 prior to the departure date and providing the following information:



- Name
- · Address of property
- · Date you are leaving & when you plan on returning
- · Emergency contact information & phone number
- Is the property alarmed?
- Will anyone else be on the property, checking on pets?

In addition to the property check, here are some tips to help keep your home secure in your absence:

- · Ask a trusted friend to check on the home on a daily basis
- Cancel mail and newspaper deliveries unless you have someone to pick them up on a daily basis to avoid accumulation
- · Use automatic timers for lights both inside and outside the home
- · Make sure all doors and windows are secured
- In the summer have someone cut the grass while you are away
- Turn down the ringer on the phone, an unanswered phone will alert someone outside that no one is home



You can dispose of unwanted prescription or non-prescription drugs at police headquarters during regular business hours, 8:00 am - 4:30 pm Monday through Friday. When the offices are closed, you can come to police headquarters and use the red call box on the front porch to have an officer respond and allow you to access the MedReturn drop box.







When the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside!

• Five out of six fire deaths happen in the home. That's why you need working smoke alarms and a plan to get out of the home in case of a fire.

Make a home escape plan

- A home escape plan is a plan to get out of your home quickly.
- Get everyone in your home together. Find all doors and windows that lead outside. Make sure they open easily.
- Windows or doors with security bars, grilles, or window guards should have emergency release devices so they can be used for escape.
- Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. One way out will be the door, and the second way out may be a window or another door.
- Choose a meeting place a safe distance in front of the home where everyone should meet once they've escaped.
- Make sure your house number can be seen from the street both during the day and at night.
- Have a plan for anyone in your home who may need assistance to escape, such as young children, older adults, or people with disabilities.
- Make sure everyone knows how to call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number for your fire department.

On behalf of our officers and members, we appreciate the strong community support we've received during our annual subscription drive. If you did not donate, it is not too late! In January, Governor Tom Wolf declared an opioid emergency in the Commonwealth. In response to this, the Department of Health expanded the scope of practice for EMT's and Paramedics to allow us to leave Narcan behind for at-risk individuals who refuse to go to the hospital. Newtown Ambulance will be participating in this voluntary program as soon as a supply of Narcan is available for this purpose.

February was American Heart Month. Do you know the signs of a cardiac emergency? If you experience chest pain, sudden shortness of breath, or dizziness or nausea associated with chest pain do not drive yourself to the hospital, call 911!

Stormwater Management Program

Stormwater Management is Everyone's Responsibility

Spring is here, and it's important to remember that as stormwater flows over driveways, lawns, and sidewalks, it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants, which can end up flowing into a lake, stream, river, wetland, or coastal water. Anything that enters a storm sewer system discharged untreated into the waterbodies we use for swimming, fishing, and providing drinking water. Since pollutants carried by runoff are the nation's greatest threat to keeping our waterbodies clean, homeowners can keep common pollutants like pesticides, pet waste, grass clippings, and automotive fluids off the ground and out of stormwater by practicing healthy household habits. Adopt these healthy household habits and help protect our lakes, streams, rivers, wetlands, and coastal waters.

Vehicle and Garage

Use a commercial car wash or wash your car on a lawn or other unpaved surface to minimize the amount of dirty, soapy water flowing into the storm drain and eventually into your local waterbody. Check your vehicles (car, boat, motorcycle, other machinery and



equipment) for leaks and spills and correct as soon as possible. Clean up spilled fluids with an absorbent material like kitty litter or sand, and don't rinse the spills into a nearby storm drain. Remember to properly dispose of the absorbent material, and recycle used oil and other automotive fluids at participating service stations.

Lawn and Garden

Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly, and only in recommended amounts. Avoid application if the forecast calls for rain, since the chemicals will likely be washed into your local stream. Select native plants and grasses that are drought- and pest-resistant, since native plants require less water, fertilizer, and pesticides. Compost or recycle yard waste when possible. Water gardens during the cool times of the day to minimize evaporation loss.

Home Repair and Improvement

Purchase and use nontoxic, biodegradable, recycled, and recyclable products whenever possible, and be careful using hazardous substances like paints, solvents, and cleaners, and use only the amount needed. Clean up spills immediately and dispose of the waste safely. Clean paint brushes in a sink, not outdoors, and properly dispose of excess paints through a household hazardous waste collection program or donate unused paint to local organizations. Use native plants in your landscaping to reduce the need for watering during dry periods, and consider directing downspouts away from paved surfaces onto lawns and other measures to increase infiltration and reduce polluted runoff.

Pet Care

When walking your pet, do your neighborhood a favor and always pick up the waste and dispose of it properly. Leaving pet waste on the ground increases public health risks by allowing harmful bacteria and nutrients to wash into the storm drain and eventually into local waterbodies.

Septic System Use and Maintenance

If you have an on lot septic system, have it inspected by a professional at least every 3 years, and have the septic tank pumped as necessary (usually every 3 to 5 years). Care for the septic system drainfield by not driving or parking vehicles on it. Plant only grass over and near the drainfield to avoid damage from roots. Remember to not flush household chemicals like paint, pesticides, oil, and antifreeze, as these can destroy the biological treatment taking place in the system. Other items, such as diapers, paper towels, and cat litter can clog the septic system and potentially damage components.

Remember, storm drains connect to waterbodies!

Composting

Select your location for composting: aesthetics, good air circulation, partial shade, good water drainage near your garden and water source are a plus for convenience.

Select a composting method:

- Holding units need 6 months to 2 years to compost. They usually cost less and are good for small amounts of composting.
- Turning units need 3 to 6 weeks to compost. They cost more and are good for larger amounts of composting.
- · Compost pile or heap.
- Build your own composting bin:http://extension.missouri. edu/publications/DisplayPub.aspx?P=G6957

Water:

Moisture is needed but not too much or too little. The more green material, the less water you'll need to add. It should be moist like a damp sponge.

Air:

The organisms need air so turn the pile often and well. If you do not have a turning unit, use a pitch fork, spade, or compost aerator. Make sure to move the less decomposed material on the end to the middle.

Temperature:

Use a compost thermometer to check the temperature. Everything is going well at 120-160 degrees; weed seeds and plant diseases are killed. At 170 degrees, your composting will go even faster. Lower temperatures take longer.

What to add:

Start a new compost pile with aged manure, cottonseed meal, alfalfa meal, blood meal, or compost starter. Nitrogen comes from green materials such as food scraps, manure, and grass clippings. Carbon comes from brown materials such as dead leaves, hay, wood chips and shredded newspaper. An equal proportion of green to brown by weight is best. Use household vegetable waste, newspaper (not more than 10% of pile's weight), coffee grounds, egg shells, nutshells, leaves, grass clippings, vines, twigs, plant stalks. Add sparingly: ash, pine needles, oak

leaves, and sawdust. No fats, pet droppings, or animal products. No pesticide or herbicide treated materials. No weeds with seed heads or plants infected with or highly susceptible to diseases (roses, peonies).

How to add it:

Make scraps small so that the microbes can do their job easier. Don't squash things down.

End product:

It should look like rich, dark soil and feel crumbly with an earthy odor. No composting ingredients should be noticeable.

The Environmental Advisory Council Green Grocery Tips

Everyone knows that making wise food choices can fuel our bodies for success, fight disease, and increase our overall well-being. But did you know that making a few adjustments to your food purchasing habits can have a positive impact on our planet? Food production, packaging, and transportation are major sources of biodiversity loss and climate change, but by implementing a few of the following ideas, you'll be on your way to a healthier body and planet.

- 1. Buy local: If you don't typically shop locally, this spring is the perfect time to start. Bucks County is an abundant foodshed, with so many options for locally grown food, and many shopping choices right here in Newtown, especially once the weather gets warm. When you shop in a conventional grocery store, you likely are purchasing bananas grown in India, fish raised in Japan, apple juice made from apples grown in China. Your food may have traveled thousands of miles around the globe before it ends up on your plate and this transportation accounts for a significant portion of food related emissions. If you were to eat only locally produced foods for 1 year, you could cancel out the effects of driving 1,000 miles in an automobile. A quick search of our zip code on localharvest.org produced 107 nearby results for nearby farms and CSAs. Locally grown food also has its economic advantages, as more money stays in the community, in addition to the obvious taste advantages.
- 2. Eat organic: The number one reason why many people choose to eat organic is because of the perceived health benefits. But, the environmental impact is another good reason to purchase more organic foods. The regenerative soil






management methods of organic farming build healthy soil by increasing carbon retention. Organic farming fights the effects of global warming, improves biodiversity, and uses up to 50% less energy than conventional farming methods. Organic food still has a bit of a hoity repute in some circles because of the associated extra costs, however by purchasing food from local, organic farms when we can, where we can, we can give the industry a big boost, which can help drive down prices for everyone.

- 3. Waste not want not: Cook larger meals early in the week and save leftovers for quick lunches or for nights when you have a lot of activities. Nothing gets thrown away. Coming up with a weekly meal plan is key for reducing waste and superfluous grocery store trips each week. Plan a meal around items that I might have thrown out. Prime example: Potato peels from Saturday night's mashed potatoes might become the base layer of Sunday's loaded potato quiche. Almost any vegetable peels can be thrown in a freezer bag and used to create a delicious veggie broth! About 414 pounds of food for each American ends up in the trash every year, but with a little thrifty planning you can make the most of your grocery purchases, and reduce the amount of waste that ends up in the landfills.
- 4. Buy in bulk: Food packaging accounts for 45% of the trash in our landfills! Buying items in bulk can help eliminate some of that waste. Use an online delivery service for many of your household items like cleaning supplies, paper products and toiletries. Order enough to last for a few months at a time. This reduces transportation costs, packaging, and can often be a money saver. This philosophy can be applied to nearly every non-perishable item that you or your family uses on a regular hasis.
- 5. Be a mindful eater: It can help to be mindful of the carbon footprint involved in the production of various foods, and make intentional choices to lower your impact. Choose whole foods over processed foods, low packaging over high packaging, veggies over meats. Meat production creates a larger impact on the climate per calorie than any other food group, so by cutting back on your meat consumption, and making it a point to purchase meats locally, you can have a big impact on reducing emissions. Maybe you can incorporate a meatless Monday into your meal plan?

The EAC hopes you have found some of these tips for supporting the environment through food shopping helpful. We would love to hear what you are doing to make a difference! Don't feel overwhelmed, or like you have to make big changes all at once. Be patient with yourself and choose one of the above tips, or come up with one of your own, as a starting point toward greener eating habits.



Who Pays to Restore My Broken Outdoor Water or Sewer Lines?

Many homeowners have the misconception that their local water or sewer provider is responsible for the water service line and sewer lateral line on their property. Contrary to this belief, the water and sewer lines that service your property are actually yours, and you are responsible for them. Many homeowners who are part of an association have a similar misconception that they are not responsible for their lines, but they very well may be. Unfortunately, many homeowners only learn this when they find themselves having a major problem.

On occasion, water companies will mail letters offering homeowners coverage on their outside lines. The homeowners inevitably react, and call their insurance company or their property manager to find out if this is already covered. Unfortunately, coverage on the external water and sewer lines is rarely—if ever—the case. Typically, insurance pays to restore an insured building or structure for damage caused by an insurable event (fire, water, smoke, etc.) In other words, insurance companies might pay for the damage the broken water line causes to your home, but not the repair of the broken line itself. In a homeowner's association, water and sewer lines are often considered "Limited Common Elements". If a limited common element only services one home, then that homeowner is likely responsible for the repair of the limited common element.

To summarize, the responsibility of the broken pipe lies with the homeowner in most cases. You may be thinking, "OK, I'm responsible...so now what?" There are a couple of options available. If your water or sewer provider offers coverage, you can purchase it through them. Please check with a water or sewer authority to see if they have an alternative such as BCWSA's \$afeGuard™ Water & Sewer Maintenance Program. This maintenance program offers a broader protection than the standard coverage offered by a water company. It is also available to Non-BCWSA customers in Bucks County & Montgomery County. Helpful Tips for Summertime

As we head into the warmer SUMMER weather, here are some timely tips from the Codes Department:

- POOLS are a source of summer fun and recreation but please remember to store all chemicals out of the reach of children and pets
- OUTSIDE HOSES should be turned off when not in use...a minor leak can waste hundreds of gallons of water in a season
- PETS should be confined to one's own property and not allowed to roam the neighborhood. Please remember to clean up after your pet when you take them for walks
- PROPERTIES should be kept clear of standing water in order to prevent mosquito born illness
- LAWNS should be mowed/weeded on a regular basis to keep yards from becoming a habitat for insects and rodents.
 Properties with grass/weeds 12 inches or higher are in violation of the Township Ordinance

A Message from the Zoning Officer Regarding Permits

- Please note all Building, Zoning and Use permits are valid for six (6) months unless the work authorized by the permit is undertaken and completed.
- All required inspections, in association with the approved permit, must also be completed and approved. Failure to obtain the required inspections will invalidate the permit.
- If you have any questions concerning a permit that has been issued for any work on your property, please contact the Codes Department.

Spring Sweeping

Street sweeping in Newtown Township will begin in early spring. The winter season can leave a substantial amount of debris on the roads, possibly causing a safety hazard to motorists, and unwanted materials in the stormwater system.



There is more then 140 lane miles of road surface to maintain in Newtown Township, and the amount of material from street sweeping can be in the excess of 100 tons annually. Residents can help by using caution when traveling near the sweeper and parking cars in driveways whenever possible. The sweeping will not be scheduled by neighborhood but will continue throughout the Township well into the summer months.

Street Watch

See something wrong with a road in Newtown Township? You can report it to us and we will work towards addressing the issue.
