Environmentally-friendly Travel

Today we all need to travel, for work, school, or just shopping and going out. We mostly do so by car. You can make your travel more environmentally friendly with these options:

- Walking or biking plus it's good for your health
- Carpool plus you can use the HOV lane, socialize, multitask by discussing work, or just sleep
- Public transportation
- Train or Greyhound
- Hybrid and electric cars plus there is special parking in some places like the PA turnpike

And when you think about your upcoming summer vacation, there are environmentally friendly options for that too:

- · Green hotels and bed & breakfasts
- Camping
- · Eco-tourism or volunteer vacation
- · Eat locally
- · Walk or bike or use transportation above
- Use re-useable bottles

'Greening' Your Lawn and Garden Chores

Gardeners and weekend warriors, along with the products they use, can add up to the biggest offenders in perpetuating the not-so-eco-friendly world. Today, more eco-conscious products and tools are making their way into yards and gardens, leaving a smaller environmental footprint. Here are a few ways to you can make a difference in your yard.

Compost - More than half of the municipal solid waste in this country is made up of paper, food scraps, and other compostables. Set up a compost bin today to begin turning your kitchen scraps, such as vegetable and fruit peelings, coffee grounds, eggshells, as well as plant trimmings, leaves, straw, and shredded newspaper into free (!) fertilizer. Compost keeps waste out of landfills and creates a nutrientrich soil amendment for your lawn and garden.



Use organic pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers -Keep in mind, homeowners use seven times more chemicals per acre than those used in agriculture. Much of this runs off into lakes and streams, or leaches in to groundwater. When needed, choose an organic option for any pesticide, herbicide, or fertilizer you apply to your lawn or garden. For every synthetic option, there is an organic, or 'green', alternative. Organic pesticides and fertilizers are made from natural ingredients and are easier on the environment because they break down quickly after application, meaning they won't hang around in the soil or water for a long time. Many 'green' pesticides tend to target specific pests, where traditional synthetic options are non-selective, meaning they will kill any bug, including the good ones like lady beetles and honey bees. However, don't assume all organic products are totally safe-be sure to read label directions carefully to ensure proper use and handling. There are a lot of choices out there, but whatever you choose you will have a beautiful lawn and garden that is safe for you, your children, pets, and local wildlife.

Grow a non-toxic lawn - More land in the United States is planted in turf, approximately 32 million acres. Typical American lawns suck up 10,000 gallons of supplemental (meaning non-rainwater) water annually. That's 60% of our cities' clean water. Minimize your chemical and water use by following these tips:

- Mow with a sharp blade. Dull blades tear the grass inviting disease organisms.
- Cut only 1/3 of the height of the grass at each mowing.
 Raise your mower height to 3 inches, 3.5 inches in the shade. Taller grass outcompetes weeds and develops deep, drought tolerant root systems.
- Practice grasscycling (a.k.a leave grass clippings). Short clippings break down quickly, adding nutrients, moisture, and organic matter to the soil. A season of clippings provides a pound of nitrogen (equal to one fertilization)



to the lawn. It is a myth that grass clippings cause thatch. Research has shown that grass roots are the primary cause of thatch, not grass clippings. Thatch is composed primarily of roots, stems, rhizomes, and other plant materials. These plant materials contain large amounts of lignin (fibrous material) and decompose slowly. Grass clippings are approximately 80-85 percent water with only small amounts of lignin, and decompose rapidly.

• Water deeply, and infrequently. Frequent light watering encourages shallow roots and reduces drought tolerance. Lawns need an inch per week, if we don't get rain. To reduce evaporation, water early in the morning, meaning between 3 to 5 a.m., before the sun rises! This is the best time to water due to low winds, high humidity, and morning dew that adds to the moisture. Also, this allows the lawn to dry before night to prevent disease. Best get a timer for that hose!

Bring nature home - Learn and understand the value native plants hold and incorporate them into your landscape. Putting native plants into your garden beds and surrounding landscape will develop more biodiversity in our neighborhoods. Native plants provide the following benefits:

- Low maintenance. Once established, native plants are generally hardier and require little, if any maintenance.
- More eco-friendly. Native plants require little to no pesticides or fertilizers to survive because they are adapted to local soil and climate.
- Preserve wildlife. Native plants co-evolved with native wildlife including birds, insects, amphibians, reptiles, and mammals. They are used for food, cover, and rearing young. Non-natives do not sustain wildlife. Our songbird population has declined 10% over the last several decades, not to mention the thousands of butterfly and beneficial bug species that have declined or been lost altogether due to the overwhelming use of non-native plants, including trees, in our landscapes.
- Drought tolerant.
- Insect & disease resistant.

Non-Toxic Home Cleaning

Today's modern home is loaded with toxic substances which are designed to make life easier, but the cost of these commercial, chemical-based products can be high, including long term health problems for your family, and environmental pollution caused by their manufacture and disposal. The US National Center for Health Statistics found that in the US, 1 in 3 people suffer from allergies, asthma, sinusitis, or bronchitis. The first step for treating these conditions includes reducing or eliminating synthetic chemicals from the home environment. Most of the ingredients used in making your own non-toxic cleaning solutions can be found in your cupboards already, and ounce for ounce homemade cleaning formulas cost about one-tenth the price of their commercial counterpart!

The following list of common household products can be used alone or in combination for any number of environmentally-and family-friendly applications.

- Baking soda: cleans, deodorizes, softens water, scours.
- Soap: unscented vegetable-based soaps in flake, liquid, powder, or bar formula is biodegradable and will clean just about anything. Avoid soap containing petroleum distillates.

- Lemon: one of the strongest food-acids, effective against most household bacteria
- Borax (sodium borate): cleans, deodorizes, disinfects, softens water, cleans wallpaper, painted walls and floors.
- White Vinegar: cuts grease, removes mildew, odors, some stains and wax build-up, softens clothes.
- Washing soda (SAL Soda is sodium carbonate decahydrate, a mineral): cuts grease, removes stains, softens water, cleans walls, tiles, sinks and tubs. Use caution, it can irritate mucous membranes. Do not use on aluminum.
- Isoproply Alcohol: excellent disinfectant.
- Cornstarch: use to clean windows, polish furniture, shampoo carpets and rugs.
- Citrus solvent: clean paint brushes, oil and grease, and some stains. Use caution—may cause skin, lung or eye irritation for people with multiple chemical sensitivities (MCS, or 'sick building syndrome').

Here are a few easy recipes to get you started. Search 'non-toxic cleaning' through your favorite internet browser for many more:

All-Purpose Cleaner: Mix 1/2 cup vinegar and 1/4 cup baking soda (or 2 teaspoons borax) into 1/2 gallon (2 liters) water. Store and keep.

Air Freshener: Baking soda or vinegar with lemon juice in small dishes absorb odors. Houseplants help reduce odors. Prevent cooking odors by simmering vinegar (1tbsp in 1 cup water) on the stove while cooking. Get fish or onion smells off utensils and cutting boards by wiping with vinegar and washing in soapy water. Keep fresh coffee grounds on the counter. Grind up a lemon or orange in the garbage disposal. Simmer water and cinnamon or other spices on the stove. Place bowls of fragrant dried herbs and flowers in a room.

Window Cleaner: Put 1/4 to 1/2 teaspoon liquid soap, 3 tablespoons vinegar, and 2 cups of water into a spray bottle, and shake. Use as you would a commercial brand. The soap is important because it cuts wax residue from commercial brands you may have used in the past.

Soft Scrub: Pour 1/2 cup of baking soda into a bowl, add enough liquid soap to make a texture like frosting. Scoop mix on a sponge, and scrub. Rinses easily and doesn't leave grit. To store, add 1 teaspoon of vegetable glycerin and seal in a glass jar to keep moist.

Oven Cleaner: Sprinkle water generously over the bottom of the oven, then cover the grime with enough baking soda that the surface is totally white. Sprinkle more water over the top. Let set overnight. The grime will have loosened the next

morning. After cleaning the worst of the mess use a little liquid soap on a sponge to wash the remaining residue from the oven. Note: If this doesn't work for you, you probably didn't use enough baking soda and/or water.

Furniture Polish: Mix 1/2 teaspoon oil (olive, jojoba, or a liquid wax) and 1/4 cup vinegar or fresh lemon juice in a glass jar. Dab a soft rag in solution and wipe onto wood surfaces. Seal jar and store indefinitely.

To obtain copies of police reports please contact the Newtown Township Police Department Business Office during normal business hours, Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:30 AM and 4:30 PM by calling 215-968-2800 ext 398, or 215-579-1000.

CRIMEWA

Reports can be physically obtained from this office, located in the police building at 100 Municipal Drive. Police reports are not faxed or emailed.

For accident reports there is a fee of \$15.00, per report, payable by check, credit card or exact cash. Accident reports can also be obtained by visiting crashdocs.org.

For all other police reports there is a fee of \$20.00, per report, payable by check, credit card or exact cash.

Presentation of a valid ID is needed before a report can be released.

Accident Reports Available Online

STEPS:

- 1. Call Newtown Township Police Department (215-579-1000) to obtain the incident report number for the accident
- 2. Go to www.crashdocs.org
- 3. Follow the drop down menu for Pennsylvania → Newtown Township Police Department
- Enter your Email address → Name of involved party → Date of accident → Report number
- 5. Follow on screen prompts to completion

While physical copies of accident reports are still available for purchase from the Newtown Township Police Department's headquarters, this successful program digitizes accident reports through a partnership with the CARFAX Police Crash Assistance Program. The reports are stored electronically in a secure database and available for purchase online at www.crashdocs.org.

Reports needed by involved parties, insurance companies and other members of the public, can be easily obtained online within minutes from the home or office. Please consider that the Vehicle Code allows for up to fifteen (15) business days for an initial report to be completed and submitted. Serious accidents may require additional time to be finalized.

Vacation House Checks:

The Newtown Township Police Department has always provided this service to residents and property owners. While on routine patrol a police officer pays extra attention to your home while you are away. This service can be provided by simply calling the Police Business Office at (215) 579-1000 x398 prior to the departure date and providing the following information:

- Name
- · Address of property
- · Date you are leaving & when you plan on returning
- Emergency contact information & phone number
- · Is the property alarmed?
- Will anyone else be on the property, checking on pets?
 If you prefer to do things online, you can also visit our

website at www.newtowntwppd.org and check out our services. Listed in the Services section you will find a link to request the house check electronically and securely submit your information.

In addition to the property check, here are some tips to help keep your home secure in your absence:

- Ask a trusted friend to check on the home on a daily basis
- Cancel mail and newspaper deliveries unless you have someone to pick them up on a daily basis to avoid accumulation.
- Use automatic timers for lights both inside and outside the home
- · Make sure all doors and windows are secured
- In the summer have someone cut the grass while you are away
- Turn down the ringer on the phone, an unanswered phone will alert someone outside that no one is home Lastly, sit back, relax, and enjoy your trip!





As various vendors begin soliciting throughout the community, it is important to us that our residents remain safe. If you feel uncomfortable, DO NOT OPEN THE DOOR. Call our twenty-four hour radio dispatcher at (215) 598-7121 and an officer will respond to check the area. It is helpful if you can provide a description of the person(s) as well as a description of any vehicle. Anyone soliciting door-to-door is required to apply for and display a permit from our police department. In order for a permit to be issued, the applicant must provide police with an up to date criminal history report, picture identification, and a current residential address. Once those documents have been reviewed, the applicant is provided with a soliciting permit from the police department. Please note that the permit is no longer issued on an orange card. The permit is now a laminated 5.5" x 8.5" card that has a white background with black and red lettering. The permit includes a picture of the solicitor and lists their solicitor ID number.

Feel free to ask the person at your door if they have one, as they are required to display one at all times. If they can't show you one, call (215) 598-7121 to inform police of the situation.

There are some exceptions to the process. Religious organizations, not-for-profit organizations, and political groups are exempt from the requirement. Typically not-for-profit organizations such as the Clean Water Act will notify police that they will be canvassing the area and provide us with a list of contact names.

DEA Drug Take Back Event

The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) has scheduled another National Prescription Drug Take Back Day which will take place on **Saturday, April 27, 2019 from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm** at the **Newtown Township Administration Building**. This is a great opportunity for those who missed the previous events or for those who have subsequently accumulated unwanted and unused prescription drugs. All are invited to dispose of those medications safely and properly.

The National Prescription Drug Take Back Day addresses a crucial public safety and public health issue. Too often, unused prescription drugs find their way into the wrong hands, and the results can be devastating. According to the 2016 National Survey on Drug Use and Health, 6.2 million Americans misused controlled prescription drugs. The study shows that a majority of abused prescription drugs were obtained from family and friends, often from the home medicine cabinet.

The DEA's Take Back Day events provide an opportunity for Americans to prevent drug addiction and overdose deaths by allowing them to clean out their medicine cabinets and turn in–safely and anonymously–a record amount of prescription drugs.

In addition to these events, the Newtown Township Police Department offers residents access to a MedReturn Box located in the police lobby. This service is readily available to the community from 8:00 am until 4:30 pm Monday through Friday during regular office hours. Arrangements can be made to utilize the box outside of office hours as well. For more information, please visit our website at www.newtowntwppd.org or contact (215) 968-2800 x398.

Between the Take Back Day events and the MedReturn Box, the Newtown Township Police Department collected well over **800 pounds** of unused or unwanted prescriptions and medication over the years. Thank you for doing your part to help make this possible.

Spring Cleanup for Fire Safety

In the effort to make this "Spring Cleanup" a fire-safe one, the Fire Department provides the following tip:

TEST YOUR SMOKE DETECTORS

- Change the batteries in your smoke detectors, your Carbon Monoxide Detectors, and flashlights.
- To help prevent nuisance alarms, gentle vacuum your smoke alarms every six (6) months or as needed.
- Never borrow batteries from a smoke detector to use for toys or other equipment in your home.
- Replace all smoke alarms every ten (10) years.
- Properly dispose of oily or greasy rags. If these items must be stored, they should be kept in labeled, sealed, metal containers.
- If you store gasoline, keep it outside your home in a shed or detached garage. Keep only small quantities in tightly secured containers. Use gasoline only as a motor fuel-never as a cleaning agent.
- Use outdoor barbecue grills with caution. Place in a safe area away from buildings, windows, heating, ventilation and air conditioning units, or places with high or dead vegetation.
- Never use gasoline to start the fire, and don't add charcoal lighter fluid once the fire has started.
- Use barbecue grills outside only-not under overhangs or balconies, and away from combustibles.
- Check your propane barbecue grill hose for leaks and cracks; never store propane indoors.

In recent months the fire department has responded to fire calls in residencies where the smoke detectors are not functioning and have probably not functioned for years. If you are not testing your smoke detectors

PLEASE start and do so to be sure that they are working properly. ONLY **WORKING SMOKE** SAVE DETECTORS LIVES! Don't take for granted that your detectors are working. You should check your smoke detectors at

least once a month.

Helpful Tips For Summertime

As we head into the warmer SUMMER weather, here are some timely tips from the Codes Department:

- POOLS are a source of summer fun and recreation but please remember to store all chemicals out of the reach of children and pets.
- OUTSIDE HOSES should be turned off when not in use...a minor leak can waste hundreds of gallons of water in a season.
- PETS should be confined to one's own property and not allowed to roam the neighborhood. Please remember to clean up after your pet when you take them for walks.
- PROPERTIES should be kept clear of standing water in order to prevent mosquito born illness.
- LAWNS should be mowed/weeded on a regular basis to keep yards from becoming a habitat for insects and rodents. Properties with grass/weeds 12 inches or higher are in violation of the Township Ordinance.

A Message from the Zoning Officer **Regarding Permits**

- · Please note all Building, Zoning and Use permits are valid for six (6) months unless the work authorized by the permit is undertaken and completed.
- All required inspections in association with the approved permit must also be completed and approved. Failure to obtain the required inspections will invalidate the permit.
