

If you have unpaid Real Estate tax bills from 2019 or before, you must contact and or pay your bill to the Bucks County Tax Claim Bureau at the Bucks County Court House in Doylestown. Their contact number is 215-348-6274. For unpaid 2020 and after, County & Municipal Real Estate Tax bills, the contact is still the Tax Claim Bureau listed above, but for unpaid School Real Estate Tax bills you must now contact Council Rock's new delinquent collector, Portnoff Law Assoc. 866-211-9466.

If you wish to make a payment in person and you cannot get here during business hours, you may drop your payment in the drop box outside the Township Administration building. For online payments, please

visit our website at www.newtowntownshiptaxoffice.com, or by phone 1-800-300-8007. We use a third party servicer for e-check and credit card payments. You may pay by credit card or e-check. There is a convenience fee for this service which is outlined when you make your payment. This information is also available on the back of your tax bill.



# A Message from Chief Hearn and the Newtown Township Police Department



#### Retirement

After an extensive law enforcement career, Officer Julius Ferraro will retire from Newtown Township Police Department in September 2022.

Marine Corps. After, Ferraro served as a police officer, K-9 handler, and K-9 trainer **Chief John Hearn** for the Philadelphia Police Department from March 1982 to October 2005. He received Borough Police Department from September 2007 to September 2009, when he joined us.

At the start of his career in 1969, Ferraro entered and served in the United States several commendations and awards during his time in Philadelphia for bravery, heroism, and merit, including a Police Officer of the Year award from the canine unit in 1992. He then served as a police advisor and trainer for DynCorp International in Iraq from November 2005 to November 2006, and as a police officer for the Newtown

he specialized in helping those with Autism. Officer Jules is known for his community outreach in schools and for his legendary connection with the students and teachers from many daily visits, book readings, and police demonstrations. Wrightstown Elementary School surprised Officer Jules with a heartwarming retirement

celebration on May 25, 2022, and Goodnoe Elementary School surprised Officer Jules with another heartwarming celebration on June 8, 2022.

Jules directed, trained, and led members of the department's Honor Guard, was a member and instructor of Bucks County's Crisis Intervention Team Task Force, was involved in hostage negotiation as a former Bucks County South Central Emergency Response Team (SERT) Negotiator, and was an instructor in the Teaching Educating And Mentoring (T.E.AM.) School Liaison Program. As a strong advocate for mental health,

Newtown Elementary School also included Officer Jules in their year-end presentation on June 14, 2022. These celebrations are true testaments to the impact he has had and how much he is loved.

Officer Jules has received commendations and numerous letters of praise and thanks from residents and from surrounding police departments for his dedication, service, and assistance. Officer Ferraro is truly an exemplary member of this department and will be missed. We thank him for his service!

### **Bus Safety for Drivers**

With school in session, Newtown Township Police Department urges you to use caution when driving. If you are driving behind a bus, allow a greater following distance than if you were driving behind a car. It will give you more time to stop once the yellow lights start flashing. It is illegal in all 50 states to pass a school bus that is stopped to load or unload children. Please note that the following are reminders and NOT suggestions.

- Never pass a bus if it is stopped to load or unload children
- If the red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, traffic must stop
- The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough back to allow them space to safely enter and exit the bus - Pennsylvania law requires at least 10 feet
- You must wait until the red lights have stopped flashing and the stop arm has been withdrawn before moving
- Do not move until all the children have reached a place of safety
- Be alert and slow down; children can be unpredictable

If convicted, violators of Pennsylvania's School Bus Stopping Law will receive a 60 day driver's license suspension, five points on driving record, and a \$250 fine.

### **Student Loitering After School and Sport Game Events**

While shopping centers are open to the public, proper behavior in and around businesses is expected. For safety reasons, we ask students to pay attention to parked vehicles and to motorists traveling in and around the parking lots. We also ask that students be respectful and mindful of customers and employees. Take into consideration that large groups of juveniles can sometimes intimidate others and be disruptive. Shopping centers should be a safe and welcome place for all members of the community.



# **Lighting and Light Pollution:**

#### Twinkle Twinkle Little Star: Minimizing Bright Outdoor Lighting and Preserving Our Night Sky

Many residents are fortunate enough to be in an area where the night sky can still be enjoyed. While many people are aware of air and water pollution as serious forms of environmental degradation, few recognize light pollution — the artificial illumination of our night sky — as negatively affecting the quality of life. Bright floodlights and poorly designed outdoor light fixtures are the primary cause of our diminished ability to view stars and planets. Light pollution is not merely a nuisance to humans and an economic waste - it disturbs wildlife habitats. Scientific studies indicate that artificial night lighting disrupts the migrating, feeding, and breeding habits of many wildlife species, as well as growth patterns of trees. Outdoor lighting alters the behavior, especially of nocturnal animals, including owls, migrating birds, insect eaters such as toads and bats, and sea turtles. Migrating birds are affected because they use the constellations to navigate, and artificial

lighting can slow their migration and make it harder for them to find food as the seasons change.

#### What You Can Do to Avoid Light Pollution

- Use Lighting Only When Necessary. Good lighting should provide adequate light for the intended task, but never over-lights or throws light onto neighboring properties. Turn off lights or consider using timers or motion sensors.
- Direct the Light Downward. Use fixtures that control the light output in order to keep the light in the targeted area.
- Ask yourself: What do I need to light and how much light do I need? Higher wattage
  does not necessarily mean better lighting. Lower wattage lights have lower operational costs and typically last longer. For domestic security lights, a 150-watt lamp is
  adequate.



### Newtown Township Residency Status with Parks & Recreation

Before registering for Parks and Recreation programs through the department, we may need to verify your address within the township. All residents and neighbors are welcome to participate in programming, but there are resident and non-resident fees set by the fee schedule. The fee schedule is approved annually by the Board of Supervisors. Those residing in Newtown Township are residents, those outside the township are considered non. Many neighbors may have a Newtown mailing address, but they reside in a different township, like Wrightstown or Upper Makefield, even Newtown Borough. If you are not sure of your residency status, please call the office before creating an account and registering. Thank you!



#### **Detection and Extinguishers:**

With fall right around the corner make sure to replace the batteries in smoke alarms. Locate fire extinguishers in your home or business. If you are not sure how to check your detectors or need help replacing, call our department and we can assist you!



- No matter what type of device you use to heat your home, make sure your heating devices and/or systems are in good working order
- Teach children fire safety when being around a fire place or fire pit
- Avoid storing any combustible items near heaters

#### Halloween:

- Use flashlights instead of candles in Halloween jack-o-lanterns
- Make sure that children's costumes are made with fire retardant materials

#### **Outdoor:**

- · Clear your roof and gutters of unnecessary buildup of debris, such as pine needles and leaves

Unpolluted water collected by sump pumps must discharge to the ground surface outside of the building, a storm drain, a sump pump collection system, or a natural outlet.

Unpolluted water from sump pumps may be directed to the Township drainage system as long as permit is issued by the Code Enforcement Department.

It is illegal to discharge ground water from the sump pump to the sanitary sewer.

Water from sump pumps must never be directed to flow on or across a neighbor's property creating a nuisance condition

Sump pumps shall never discharge water over public sidewalk(s) and/or street(s) where it could cause undue maintenance to sidewalk(s) and/or street(s) and create icing conditions in winter months.



## A Message from the Newtown Township Public Works Department

#### Tree and Shrub Maintenance


Property owners should be aware that they are responsible for any trees or shrubs on their property; this includes trees along the roadway located within the "right of way."

Per Township Ordinance 2004-O-25, all trees in Newtown Township shall be kept trimmed so that the minimum clearance where they overhang any public walk shall be 9 feet. The minimum clearance where trees overhang or project into any public street or highway right-of-way shall be 11 feet.

However, the Township is hereby given the right to designate a higher clearance on certain highways, where heavy traffic or other conditions make it expedient.

In case the owner of such property shall neglect or refuse to trim such trees, plants or shrubs upon being notified in writing by the Township to do so, the Township may, after the expiration of the date specified in said notice, cause such trimming to be done at the expense of the owner.



# FACT SHEET: Lawn Care for Water Quality

Maintaining a lush, weed-free lawn is a source of pride for many homeowners. To accomplish this, however, many property owners over-apply nitrogen and phosphorus fertilizers. Homeowners also apply herbicides and pesticides to their lawns to get rid of weeds and insects. During storm events, runoff collects these chemicals, discharging them into local streams. Discharge from a single property may seem insignificant, but the combination of lawn areas in an entire watershed is significant.

#### Why is it a Problem?

High nitrogen and phosphorus levels in streams are bad for water quality. The excessive nutrients spur rapid algae growth, which can block sunlight from reaching below the surface. Eventually the algae die, and this process uses large quantities of oxygen levels in the water. Without oxygen, the stream becomes a dead zone unable to support aquatic life. Each summer, large dead zones occur in the Chesapeake Bay because of excessive nutrients.

#### Maintain a Healthy Lawn to Protect Water Quality

A healthy lawn not only looks great, but it also helps maintain water quality. Proper lawn care and maintenance can positively affect the environment by minimizing the amount of fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides that enter our waterways. Phosphorus is a huge pollutant, and it comes from many sources including lawn clippings and fertilizers. During a heavy rain event, stormwater runoff picks up and carries improperly discarded yard waste and chemicals into our streams, creeks, and lakes – polluting our waterways and ultimately tainting our water quality. our water quality.

#### What Can You Do?

There are many things you can do to minimize the amount of fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides polluting our streams. Listed below are a few items to consider that can help reduce the risk of tainting our water quality:

- Reduce the size of your lawn. Add landscaped beds with native trees. shrubs, and perennials. This minimizes mowing time, reduces gasoline exhaust, reduces runoff, and provides food and habitat for wildlife species
- Maintain a variety of plants in your lawn. Turf grass has very short roots, but other plants have long tuberous roots that pull nutrients and water deep into the soil.
- Reduce watering. Lawns need to rest after the spring growth spurt. During
- Reduce watering. Lawns need to rest after the spring growth spurt. During the dry season, turf grass uses stored energy to grow deep roots. Use a mulching mower. Shredded grass dippings return nutrients to the soil. If you do not have a mulching mower, dispose of grass dippings properly. Do not dump into nearby streams, swales, or stormwater facilities. The nutrients in the dippings will encourage algae growth. If you choose to collect grass clippings, you should compost them. Conduct soil tests once every three years. Determine the actual fertilizer requirements of your soil and apply half the recommended amount. Minimize fertilizers. Less fertilizer means less excess entering runoff. Aerate your lawn. Aerating allows oxygen and water to become more available to root systems, reducing runoff.

#### Proper Mowing to Maintain a Healthy Lawn

- Mow only when grass is dry to get a clean cut and minimize the spread of diseases.

  Mow grass to a height of not less than 3 inches, Longer grass biades allow it to out-compete weeds, reducing the need for herbicides.

  Mow frequently, cutting no more than 1/3 of the grass height each time.

  Sharpen mower blades once a year to avoid damaging grass blades.



- Property owners spread close to 215 million pounds of nitrogen fertilizer on their lawns. approximately 40 percent of which conveys to streams via stormwater runoff or infiltrates groundwater supplies.
- A healthy, dense lawn prevents runoff, absorbing rainfall six times more effectively than a wheat field.
- A well designed and maintained landscape increases a home's property value by 15 to 20 percent
- The most popular lawn ornament is the pink flamingo.

#### HEATING SEASON, INSULATION R-VALUE, AND BUILDING ENERGY EFFICIENCY.

Heating season is upon us again and as I wish for a mild season sprinkled with a few memorable snow events (for the kids, of course) I want to remind everyone how inefficient our buildings are. I'm talking about heat loss. We heat our homes and offices only to allow that heat to be drawn right through to the cold outside. Even though we have insulated walls and ceilings there is a constant flow of heat from the warm inside to the cold outside. Can't we stop this cycle of heat loss? If not to prevent hard earned dollars from escaping to the cold than to mitigate the wasteful burning of fossil fuels. We need an insulation efficiency upgrade!



Let's unpack this a little.

Everything from car engines and passenger airplanes to consumer electronics and cell phones have undergone massive efficiency upgrades. This momentum is fueled by government energy efficiency regulations and business's bottom lines. But what about our humble homes and shops? We haven't seen much in energy upgrades since the founding fathers constructed their homes. Today's homes have only become bigger, consuming more energy to heat and cool. Although it seems that the efficiency emphasis is placed on cars, buildings account for nearly 40% of US energy use and greenhouse gas emissions.

While manufacturers take care of delivering the next generation of energy efficient products, the public is left to attend to their homes and offices with whatever means available. I'm sure over the last few years everyone has had a chance to replace their inefficient Edison-style light bulbs with LED bulbs. Today some of these LED bulbs use 1/10th the energy of the incandescent bulbs they replaced. This is the low hanging fruit of building efficiency.

lighting. Heating and cooling accounts for more than lighting, appliances, tv's, computers, and water heaters combined. The good news is that heat flow can be slowed down by providing a higher level of insulation. I will call this, "insulation efficiency".


The performance characteristic of insulation is called, R-value, which refers to a materials ability to resist the flow of heat. All materials have an R-value. Wood has a higher R-value than metal. The best insulating materials are dense with tiny voids that can fill with air slowing the transfer of heat to the next tiny air-filled void.

The minimum R-values for insulation in walls and ceilings are dictated by the building codes and have been unchanged for a few generations. Meanwhile, the TV has made leaps and bounds in energy efficiency. For example, a new LED TV has an estimated yearly operating cost of only \$10.

Thankfully, in 2018 Pennsylvania adopted an updated building code that prescribed higher building insulation values. Overnight the new standard of insulation became what was once required for cold places like Minnesota and Vermont. This is not overkill, this is efficiency. This is a tiny win for the health of the planet, its people, and the goal of

It's a tiny step in the right direction for building efficiency on a broad scale. Unfortunately, due to the longer life-cycle of buildings many will never see the increased R-value enhancements. Current buildings will most likely see their owners pay higher heating and cooling costs year after year.

The time is right for the next generation of energy efficient buildings to be built. Not only do building codes require more efficient buildings but living or working in one will make you appear smarter and more humanitarian by helping fight the fossil fuel scourge. An energy efficient building will most definitely have a higher R-value insulation in the walls and ceiling. Higher than even the Pennsylvania code minimum. Heat created for the comfort of the occupants will not hastily leave the building just because it's cold outside. An energy efficient building will most likely repay the owner with lower energy demand and possibly be powered by the sun. An energy efficient building will always be beautiful.



Even if you plan to stay in your current home for a while, there are a few things you can do to increase your insulation efficiency. The first step is a home energy audit. This professional service will help outline the areas that can reasonably be improved upon. The easiest place to increase insulation is in the attic. In places without storage, you can add insulation to the new standard which is R-49. This is a 14" thick blanket of fluffy denim or fiberglass. If you can measure less than 8" or so of insulation in your attic than you can double the efficiency of the insulation by adding the required amount. Heat loss is greater through the ceiling then through walls which is good for the retrofit since it's much harder to change the width of your walls.

However, if you are considering new siding, there are a few options. Insulating siding is vinyl siding with foam attached behind it. This continuous layer of R-2 insulation will help offset some of the dead spots you get in a standard stud wall with insulation between. The next step up is a thicker layer of foam board between an R-5 and R-10 installed over the existing sheathing.

Once you reinstall the siding you will have a wall that meets or exceeds the building code values.

These are only a few of the techniques for bringing your existing building up to date with energy efficiency upgrades. The list of smart steps includes Low-E window replacement; energy- efficient lighting, heating, and cooling equipment; airsealing; duct sealing; on-site renewable energy generation; and whole-house automated control and monitoring systems. Any combination of these solutions will add energy efficiency to your existing building creating a more comfortable enjoyable home, reduce fossil fuel use, and save on operating expenses.

### **Township Takes Action on Single-Use Plastics**

Newtown Township has taken action to tackle the problem of single-use plastics that are toxic and polluting our environment, including our local waterways, seriously harming and killing our wildlife and now potentially harming our own health. The Board of Supervisors unanimously passed a Resolution 5-0 on April 13, 2022 that encourages our businesses and residents to voluntarily reduce their consumption of plastic bags, straws, cutlery and polystyrene containers and to replace them with reusable bags, biodegradable or compostable alternatives. Education is the key to understanding and to changing our mind set and use of single use plastics.

With this Resolution, we are in good company, joining numerous surrounding municipalities and major cities in Pennsylvania and around the nation. Surrounding states include New Jersey, New York, Delaware, Connecticut to Maine. Even all United Nations member nations have banned single-use plastics. Canada will now be the latest to ban the manufacture and importation of "harmful" single-use plastics, and was first to phase out hard to recycle plastics in 2019.

We are asking all of our residents to "bring your own bag" to the supermarkets and to all retail stores. For small items, please decline using a bag. For take-out food orders, please encourage retailers to avoid using plastic bags and styrofoam containers. Decline plastic cutlery and straws for orders that you bring home. Use your own water bottle instead of buying a plastic water bottle.

What is a single-use-plastic and why should we tackle the problem?

These plastics are made predominately from toxic fossil fuel-based chemicals, mostly natural gas, and meant to be disposed of right after use, often in minutes. Single-use plastics include thin plastic bags, food wrappers, food containers, cups, plastic straws, plastic throw away utensils, stirrers and bottles. Dry cleaning bags get thrown away as soon as you get home although they are often exempt from resolutions and ordinances until a better solution is found, but no less toxic. Ninety percent of these plastics end up in landfills. Thin plastic bags cannot be recycled as they contaminate and clog the recycling machines.

Nothing we use for a short period of time should pollute our environment for centuries! The growing threat that plastic poses is clear. Throw away plastics account for 40-50% of all plastic produced each year and is expected to double by 2050. The numbers that are thrown away are staggering and growing! We throw away 100 billion plastic bags, 25 billion Styrofoam coffee cups, and 50 billion water bottles. And this does not account for the plastic packaging for many of our food items or consumer goods we purchase.

People do not make the connection between the petro-chemicals used to make these plastic products and the resulting severe environmental impact. Did you know that it takes 400 to 1000 years to break down these plastics in your landfills? When plastic does degrade or is incinerated, it emits toxic chemicals from the thousands of additives and colorants used to give it strength, flexibility, heat resistance and transparency, causing air pollution, contributing to green-house gases and global warming.

In March of 2021, the PennEnvironment Research and Policy Center released a report "Microplastics in Pennsylvania: A Survey of Waterways." It found that all 53 waterways tested across Pennsylvania had microplastic contamination. Microplastics are small fragments of plastic, no bigger than a sesame seed. Our rivers and oceans are also inundated with either floating plastic pollution or plastic sediment. There are now five huge patches in the oceans around the world that contain high concentrations of plastic debris. Microplastics were found in 60 percent of all seabirds, 100 percent of turtles and beached whales. They have contaminated more than 100 aquatic species including the seafood that we eat, such as fish, shrimp and mussels. In fact, one in three fish caught worldwide have been found to have ingested plastic that can block their digestive tract, puncture organs and disrupt their reproductive systems. Floating plastic pollution has been found to injure and strangle marine life. Birds even eat plastic mistaking it for food. Research revealed that plastic is now found in OUR blood and organs. The results are alarming and should be a wake-up call to all of us.

Americans support recycling, but plastic recycling accounts for a dismal 5 percent, down from a high of 9.5 percent in 2014. In fact, plastic recycling has been documented to not work due to the thousands of different plastic characteristics that


cannot be separated. Just one fast-food meal can involve many different types of single-use plastic, including cups, lids, clam shell trays, bags and cutlery.

We need to start somewhere. Ultimately, we need to move from a throw-away society to a circular economy on the corporate side, with a transition to environmentally safe and sustainable products.

We can all do our part starting now by complying with our voluntary resolution to limit our consumption of single-use plastics.


