A Note From Tammy Sutton, Newtown Township, Tax Collector

When you are making payments to this office, please be sure to use our correct mailing address:

100 MUNICIPAL DRIVE SUITE 101 NEWTOWN, PA 18940 Just a few reminders to Newtown Township Taxpayers. The new tax year has begun, and the first Real Estate Tax Bills were issued March 1, 2025. This is the County & Municipal Real Estate Tax bill. If you do not receive your bill, please contact this office. The Tax Collector has no authority to extend due dates or waive penalties, even if you didn't get your bill. The due date to obtain the 2% discount is, as always, April 30th. The

due date to avoid penalty is, as always, June 30th. The 2023 School R/E tax bill AND the 2023 Occupation Tax bill will be issued July 1, 2023. If you have unpaid Real Estate tax bills from 0242 or before, you must contact and or pay your bill to the Bucks County Tax Claim Bureau at the Bucks County Court House in Doylestown for an unpaid COUNTY & MUNICIPAL R/E bill. Their contact number is 215-348-6274. For unpaid 2024 or before SCHOOL Real Estate Tax bills you must contact Council Rock's delinquent collector. Portnoff Law Assoc. 866-211-9466.

If you wish to make a payment in person and you cannot get here during business hours, you may drop your payment in the drop box outside the Township Administration building. For Online payments please visit our website www.newtowntownshiptaxoffice.com, or by phone 1-800-300-

8007. We use a third party servicer for e-check and credit card payments. You may pay by credit card or e-check. There is a convenience fee for this service which is outlined when you make your payment. This information is also available on the back of your tax bill.

If you need to make a change to your occupational status or report a change in residency related to your Occupation Tax bill, please contact Council Rock School District Tax Office to report your change 215-944-1090.



New Police Officers & Promotion

We are proud to introduce the newest members of our team!

On September 27, 2024, 25-year-old Matthew Giamboy was officially sworn-in as a police officer for Newtown Township Police Department by District Judge Petrucci. Ofc. Giamboy graduated from Roman Catholic High School in 2017, obtained an Associate in Arts from LaSalle University in 2020, and completed the Pennsylvania Municipal Officers Training Program at the Philadelphia Police Academy in 2022. Prior

to joining us, Giamboy was a police officer with the City of Philadelphia since 2022 and was assigned to the 25th District for the duration.

On September 27, 2024, 31-year-old Jacob Blickley was officially sworn-in as a police officer for Newtown Township Police Department by District Judge Petrucci. Ofc. Blickley graduated from Neshaminy High School in 2011 and completed the Pennsylvania Municipal Officers Training Program at the Montgomery County Municipal Police Academy in 2016. Prior to joining us, Blickley started his career with the Tullytown Borough

Police Department in 2016 and was a police officer with the Falls Township Police Department since 2017.

Drivers must move over or slow down for all responders, including police, fire, and ambulance crews, as well as stopped tow trucks and maintenance vehicles. Additionally, a similar regulation requires motorists to move over or slow down when approaching a stationary trash or recycling truck.

Failure to move over or slow down will result in a citation that carries a fine of \$500 for first time offenders, \$1,000 for a second offense, and \$2,000 and a 90-day license suspension for a third or subsequent offense. Penalties are increased for incidents that seriously injure or kill another person.





Retirement

After dedicating over 27 years of service to the Newtown Township Police Department, Cpl. Timothy Keegan retired on December 31, 2024.

Prior to his time with us, Timothy Keegan was a Park Ranger. Then he was hired by Chief Duffy and joined the Newtown Township Police Department on October 27, 1997. In 2012, he was promoted to Corporal.

Throughout his career, he received several lifesaving commendations and countless letters of appreciation and recognition from members of the community, neighboring police departments, and even the Mayor of Houston,

Texas. He was always available to help a member of the community and let them know that they were being heard. He was also always willing to share his vast knowledge of wildlife, especially birds.

Tim Keegan was an exemplary member of this department. We thank him for his service and wish him a long, happy and healthy retirement.

A Message from Chief Hearn and the Newtown Township Police Department

Recruitment and retention of Public Safety personnel

Thank you for your ongoing support year after year to the men and women of the Newtown Township Police Department. This department has a great history of dedication and service to our community by our officers and professional support staff. We will continue to do so with professionalism and a guardian mindset, always putting our community first.

With this newsletter, I want to ask a favor and request your continued support by encouraging our future generations to consider dedicating their lives to public safety. This includes becoming **police officers**, volunteering with the fire service, taking CPR/1st aid classes, or volunteering for the local Red Cross chapter.

When I was selected as the police chief, our team and I were tasked with recruiting and hiring the best candidates to provide police services in Newtown and Wrightstown townships. In just six short years since my arrival, with planned retirements, career changes, and unfortunately the passing of one of our own, the Newtown Township Police Department was very busy. We hired 17 new officers, promoted a Captain, Lieutenant, 3 Sergeants, and 5 Corporals, and assigned 2 new Detectives to our detective division. We replaced our aging police vehicle fleet and obtained grants for technology enhancements, including License Plate readers to assist in criminal investigations, body-worn cameras to support criminal prosecutions, and an additional School Resource Officer to protect our children. We have completed a building study on the need for a new police facility which will, once approved, continue to service the community in the best manner possible, all while operating under the best practices as evidenced by retaining Accreditation status for the fourth time since 2013. This was all possible due to tremendous support from our community & business members, our religious partners, the Township Manager, and the Board of Supervisors.

Although we are progressing, we still struggle, as most organizations do, to get qualified applicants to apply and take on this awesome public safety responsibility. It is demanding: shift work, rotating days off, working weekends and holidays, and often missing many family gatherings and special events. You may even be called to give your life to safeguard others. It is a calling that few are willing to take. Police applicants throughout the county and state have dropped dramatically. Philadelphia County is short over 1300 officers, and the Pennsylvania State Police has recently modified their hiring practices to obtain more recruits. We are all struggling.

In addition to the police department, the volunteer fire service is experiencing the same challenges. As a volunteer firefighter for over twenty-eight years, I also know the dramatic reduction of volunteers that has impacted communities' fire safety. In my early days of being a volunteer, there were over 300,000 volunteer firefighters in the state of Pennsylvania. Today, there are less than 38,000. This impacts public safety as evident with the recent hurricanes, Helene & Milton, in the southern states of Florida, Georgia, North & South Carolinas, and Tennessee, or the terrible wildfire in California. The tragedies would be much higher if not for the efforts of the public safety personnel who have dedicated their lives to risking it all for others.

My ask is simple. If you see an officer, a firefighter, or a medical technician – thank them! If you know someone who could benefit our community by serving others in this role, encourage and support them. Encouraging and supporting the younger generations will ultimately positively affect us all by providing safety and security to our communities. Please support the local efforts of elected officials when decisions are being considered to bolster staffing or replace outdated equipment and facilities.

Finally, help to keep our emergency workers safe. When you see an emergency vehicle approaching with its lights and sirens activated, pull to the side of the roadway and stop. Allow the emergency vehicle to pass safely – it may save a life. If you see an emergency vehicle with emergency equipment operating on the side of a roadway, slow down to under 20 MPH, and pass cautiously. They also have families to return home to.

A Message about Stormwater Management

Summer Storm Water Management Tips

- 1. Wash your car at a car wash. When you wash your car on the driveway or the street, grease, soap and oil can wash into streams and creeks.
- 2. Never dump anything down stormwater drains. Remember that storm drains empty directly into local waterways without being treated so whatever enters storm drains will flow into streams and creeks.
- 3. Direct downspouts over porous, not paved surfaces. Where possible, direct downspouts into garden beds, your lawn or consider installing a rain barrel. 4) Raise your mower height. Raising your mower height to at least 3 inches will slow of the flow of water over your lawn and allow it to absorb more rain water



A message from Newtown Township Codes and Zoning Department

Schools are back in session this fall and it's important to keep public sidewalks clear for pedestrian use and primarily for the safety and welfare of children who will need to use public sidewalks to travel safely to and from neighborhood bus stops.

Therefore, it's important for homeowners to keep tree branches, plants & shrubs trimmed so they do not obstruct use of public sidewalks as per Chapter 25, Section 101, Newtown Township Code of Ordinances, as noted below...

§ 25-101 Tree Trimming.

All trees in Newtown Township shall be kept trimmed so that the minimum clearance where they overhang any public walk shall be nine feet and the minimum clearance where they overhang or project into any public street or highway right-of-way shall be 11 feet. However, the Township is hereby given the right to designate a higher clearance on certain highways, where heavy traffic or other conditions make it expedient.

All trees, plants or shrubs standing on private property and having branches projecting into or over a public highway or right-of-way, shall be kept trimmed by the owner of such private property so that no portion thereof shall extend into or over a sidewalk or right-of-way below the minimum clearance specified above, or such other clearance as may be specified by the Township. In winter months, public sidewalks should be cleared of snow; ice as per Chapter 21, Sections 202 & 203, Newtown Township Code of Ordinances, as noted below...

§ 21-202 Snow Removal from Sidewalks

It shall be the duty of the property owner, not later than 24 hours after snow has ceased to fall, to clear or cause to be cleared a pathway in the sidewalk upon which such property abuts. Such pathway shall not be less than 30 inches in width and shall be thoroughly cleared to that extent of snow or ice or other obstruction. It shall be unlawful for any property owner to allow or permit snow or ice to lie upon or remain upon or piled or accumulated upon a sidewalk within the Township for more than 24 hours.

\S 21-203 Method of Snow and Ice Removal from Sidewalks and Driveways

- 1. Snow or ice removed from sidewalk areas or driveways shall be placed on the person's property.
- 2. If there shall be a sufficient amount of snow or ice and there is no longer any place on the Person's property to shovel or remove the snow, then it may be placed along the berm or curb line, but not in the paved street or road.
- 3. Should the snow and ice on the sidewalk or footpath be frozen so that it cannot be removed without injury to the pavement or damaging the base of the footpath, the person having charge of the ice and snow removal, shall cause the sidewalk abutting or adjacent to such premises to be strewn and to be kept strewn with ashes, sand, or any suitable abrasive material and shall as soon thereafter as the weather shall permit, thoroughly clean such sidewalks.
- 4. Fire hydrants shall not be covered.



WILL WE HAVE COMMUNITY SOLAR IN PENNSYLVANIA?

HERE COMES THE SUN

In late March of 2024, the Pennsylvania House passed a bill that would allow the establishment of Community solar programs in the Commonwealth.

This bill was a win-win-win for Pennsylvanians as it would have opened access to more renewable energy, ease the amount of energy output from the electric grid, help protect the environment and bring in thousands of well paying jobs to the Commonwealth, This would benefit untold numbers of people who live in homes that do not have the ability to support solar panels on their property.

The bill would allow for the creation, financing, accessibility, and operation of Community solar facilities with guaranteed savings, and encourage the development of community programs that attract robust participation.

BUT HOW FAST CAN A TURTLE RUN?



The Community solar Bill HB 1842 had great House bipartisan support in the Spring of last year. However when it got to the Senate, it lay in the Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee like one of the basking turtles at the Delaware Canal.

The basking bill was left to languish in committee, and was never forwarded to the Senate for a vote before the 2024 session ended.

IS COMMUNITY SOLAR A NEW CONCEPT?

Not at all! As of the summer of 2024, at least one Community solar project was located in 44 states and the District of Columbia. Of that, solar is concentrated in four states: Florida, New York, Massachusetts, and Minnesota. When it comes to solar panels, not all states are created equal; different parts of the country are more hospitable than other because of the differences in climate that are better suited for installation. A lot of cloud cover or smog will inhibit effectiveness. In a few areas, solar power

may be less expensive than fossil-generated electricity which would likely deter its use.

FROM PANEL TO GRID TO CONSUMER

The Department of Energy defines Community solar as any solar project or purchasing program within a geographical area, in which the benefits flow to multiple customers, such as individuals, non profits, and other groups. In most cases, this is an off-site operation.

Since the panels are providing more electricity than needed, there is a dollar "kick-back" to the consumer in the form of a credit on their electric bill.

WHO CAN BENEFIT?

We as residents or businesses can receive electrical power that is generated from a solar array sending enough energy to serve whole neighborhoods. Apparently nearly half of our households and businesses are unable to install their own rooftop solar. Shading, roof size and orientation, up front costs, and local restrictions can create barriers to easily acquiring rooftop solar systems. So, apartment dwellers, condominium residents, and HOA folks are among those who can benefit greatly if the conditions are right. They can take advantage of off site solar arrays to service many users.

HOW DO WE PROMOTE THIS BILL?

The bill is primed to succeed in 2025, and both our state Representative Perry Warren and state Senator Steve Santasiero for Newtown had championed this bill with co-sponsorships.
